The SASEC Trade Facilitation Strategic Framework has identified Customs automation as one of its strategic priorities, which includes automation of Customs management system. Of the six SASEC countries, Bangladesh, the Maldives, Nepal and Sri Lanka have chosen ASYCUDA as their core Customs automation system. These countries are at different stages of implementation but all seek to implement the ASYCUDA World with its full functionalities as the core Customs system for Single Window.
