Negotiation of Protocols for the IMT Motor Vehicle Agreement

16-17 September 2015: Bangkok, Thailand

The Ministry of Transport of Thailand organized a meeting to negotiate proposed protocols for the India-Myanmar-Thailand Motor Vehicle Agreement (IMT MVA). This Meeting approved the final text of the draft IMT MVA, including the recommended period of temporary admission with Customs duty exemption. The Meeting also agreed to hold a trial run of vehicles from Thailand to India through Myanmar in December 2015, and hold the IMT MVA signing by the Transport Ministers in January 2016.

Bhutan's Department of Revenue and Customs conducted a 3-day Consultation Meeting to present and discuss the draft Rules and Regulations associated with the Customs Act of Bhutan to key Customs officials. It provided the platform to discuss and clarify issues related to Customs policy and procedures; finalize many of the 28 identified areas that require Rules and Regulations; and identify critical issues on the draft Customs Rules and Regulations 2015.

8-9 September 2015: Dhaka, Bangladesh

The Road Transport and Highways Division, Ministry of Road Transport and Bridges of Bangladesh organized a Meeting on the Proposed Protocols to the Bangladesh-Bhutan-India-Nepal Motor Vehicles Agreement (BBIN MVA) to consider provisions of the draft protocol on the movement of passenger and cargo vehicles under the BBIN MVA. The Meeting agreed on the substantive contents of the proposed protocol on passenger vehicles, arrangements for pilot implementation/trial runs of the cargo vehicles, and the way forward, including trial runs on cargo vehicle movement, pilot run for regular passenger transport, BBIN Car Rally, and signing of the Protocol on Passenger Vehicular Movement.

Subregional Workshop on ASYCUDA World 8-11 September 2015: Pokhara, Nepal

The Nepal Department of Customs hosted a Subregional Workshop on ASYCUDA World with representatives from four SASEC countries using ASYCUDA- Bangladesh, the Maldives, Nepal, and Sri Lanka. The Workshop adopted a report of proceedings and formulated action points for implementing ASYCUDA World in the SASEC subregion. The four country delegations shared experiences on implementation of ASYCUDA. A detailed presentation on the functional side of ASYCUDA World was delivered by UNCTAD representatives.

The Department of Revenue and Customs (DRC), Ministry of Finance, Bhutan conducted the second in a series of User Acceptance Testing (UAT) of the Revenue Administration and Management System (RAMIS) Customs and Excise Module for focal officials of DRC on 17-25 August 2015, in Thimphu, Bhutan. Following the second UAT, the DRC focal officials delivered hands-on testing and training sessions to over 280 Customs officers throughout Bhutan to build in-house capacity and skills in operating RAMIS, DRC's upgraded automated system for Customs clearance procedures to be rolled out in early 2016.

Strategic Master Plan for Chittagong Port Unveiled 7 September 2015: Dhaka, Bangladesh

A new master plan outlining a 25-30 year vision for Chittagong Port has been unveiled in Dhaka, Bangladesh. Development under the plan is expected to increase port efficiency and is estimated to cost around \$1.9 billion. Recommendations include: construction of three key terminals in the port area, including a container terminal on the existing general cargo berths and a new multipurpose terminal for non-container cargo; port facility on a small island in the Bay of Bengal; and expansion of hinterland links, including roads.

The Government of Bangladesh will develop the country's land ports to spur regional trade, undertaking around \$84.76 million worth of projects to improve land port

infrastructure, warehouse facilities, Customs control procedures, and the institutional and regulatory framework. This initiative will facilitate more efficient movement of goods by cutting border-crossing times to and from Bangladesh, toward Bhutan, India, and Nepal.

Bangladesh businessmen envisage increased trade with India if constraints on land port infrastructure are addressed. Land ports and land Customs stations play a significant role

in the country's trade within the subregion. Current limitations in infrastructure, communication, and excessive documentation create hurdles for trade efficiency.


